Juneteenth is a holiday celebrated on June 19th to commemorate the end of slavery in the United States. It marks the day in 1865 when Union soldiers arrived in Galveston, Texas, and announced that all enslaved people were to be freed. Although the Emancipation Proclamation had been signed two and a half years earlier, it was not enforced in Texas until this day. Juneteenth is celebrated with parades, picnics, and community gatherings, and is an important day to recognize the struggles and achievements of African Americans. It is now recognized as a federal holiday in the United States.



Bridgeport will celebrate Juneteenth on June 10th, 2023, from 11 am to 5 pm at Seaside Park. The event will feature entertainment, vendors, art, ethnic food, food trucks, an urban farmer's market, and demonstrations. For More Info Contact 203-545-8146 or email:

Minority Business Certifications

There are several types of minority-owned certifications, including:


- 1. Minority Business Enterprise (MBE) Certification: This certification is issued by the National Minority Supplier Development Council (NMSDC) and provides access to corporate and government contract opportunities, networking events and business development resources.
- 2. Women's Business Enterprise (WBE) Certification: This certification is issued by the Women's Business Enterprise National Council (WBENC) and provides access to corporate and government contract opportunities, networking events, and business development resources.
- 3. Disadvantaged Business Enterprise (DBE) Certification: This certification is issued by the U.S. Department of Transportation and provides access to federal transportation contracts.
- 4. Small Business Administration (SBA) 8(a) Business Development Certification: This certification provides access to federal contracts, specialized business training, and mentoring opportunities.

The benefits of each certification vary, but generally include increased access to business opportunities, networking events, and business development resources. These certifications can also enhance a business's reputation and credibility, and may provide a competitive advantage when bidding on contracts.

GETTING INVOVLED


